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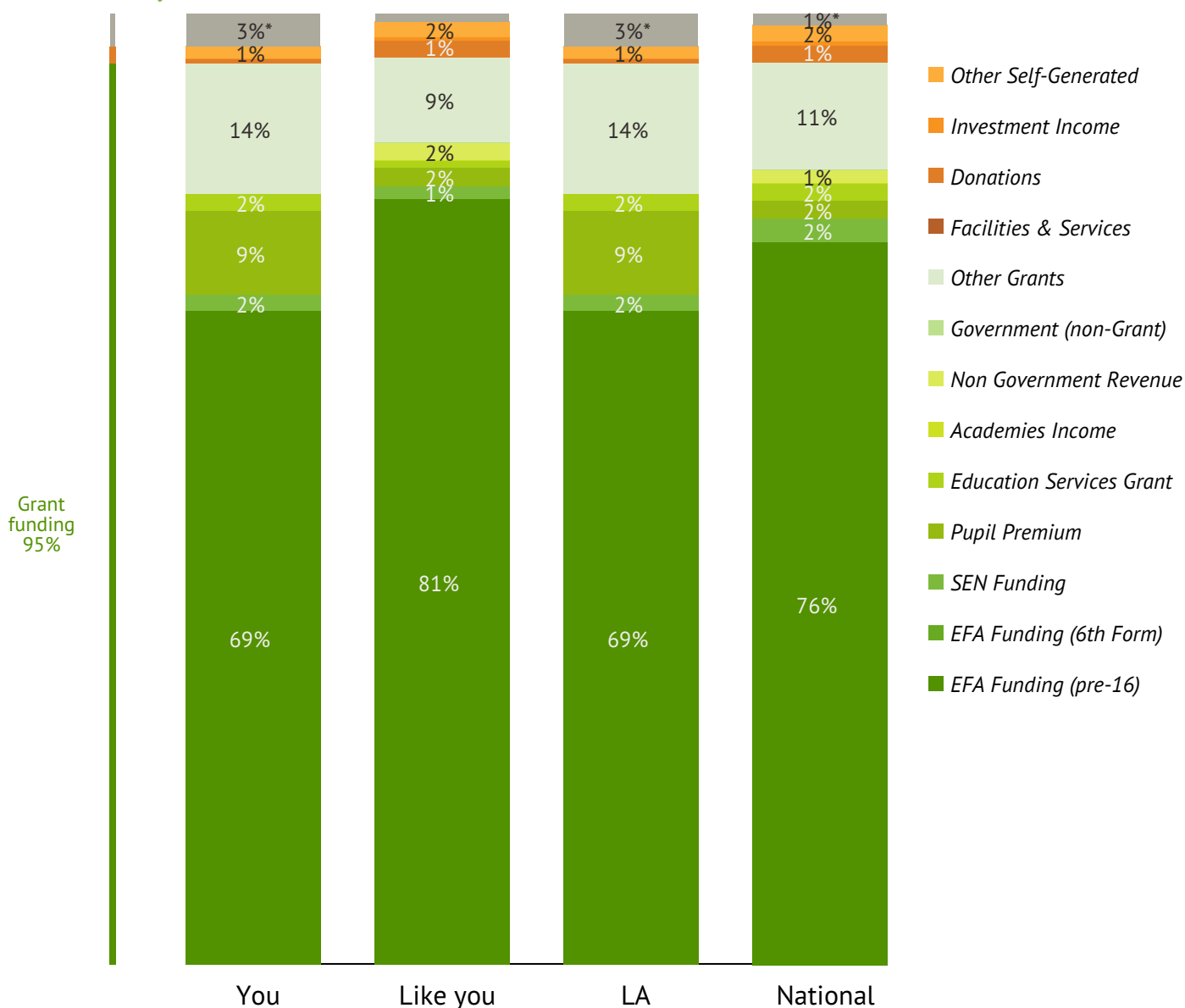
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How Sunnyville received £7,914 per pupil

Compared to academies like you: Sunnyville receives 0.6% less from grant funding and 2.0% less from self-generated funding. In particular, Sunnyville receives noticeably more in pupil premium, education services grant and other grants, and noticeably less in non government revenue, facilities & services and investment income.

Compared to the national average for all-through academies: Sunnyville receives 0.1% less from grant funding and 2.2% less from self-generated funding. In particular, Sunnyville receives noticeably more in pupil premium, and noticeably less in SEN funding, non government revenue, investment income and other self-generated.



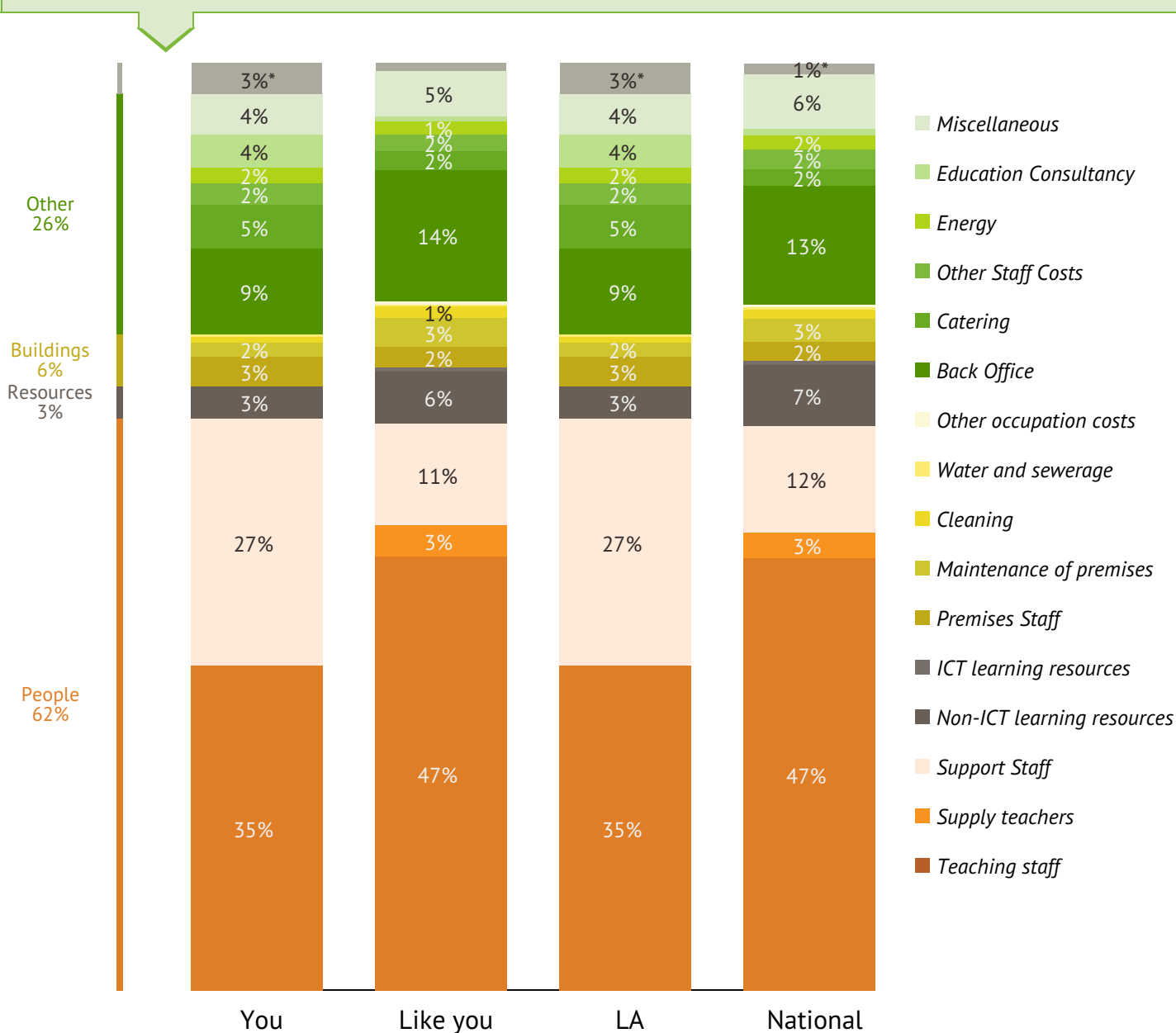

How Sunnyville spent £8,533 per pupil

Compared to academies like you: Sunnyville spends 0.5% more on people, 2.6% less on resources, 1.5% less on buildings and 1.1% more on other. In particular, Sunnyville spends noticeably more on support staff, premises staff, water and sewerage, catering and education consultancy, and noticeably less on teaching staff, non-ICT learning resources, maintenance of premises, cleaning and back office.

Compared to the national average for all-through academies: Sunnyville spends 0.8% more on people, 3.6% less on resources, 0.4% less on buildings and 1.0% more on other. In particular, Sunnyville spends noticeably more on support staff, premises staff, catering and education consultancy, and noticeably less on teaching staff, non-ICT learning resources, maintenance of premises, cleaning, back office and miscellaneous.

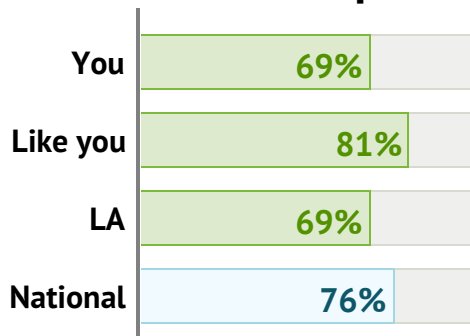
EFA funding for Pre-16 Students

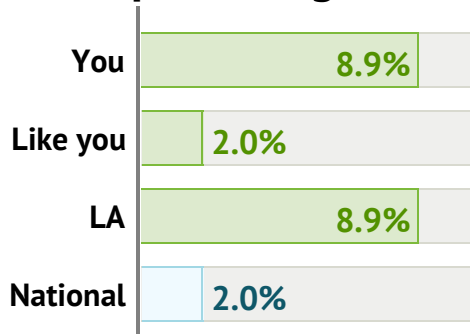

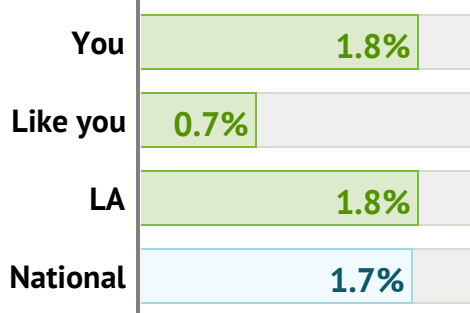

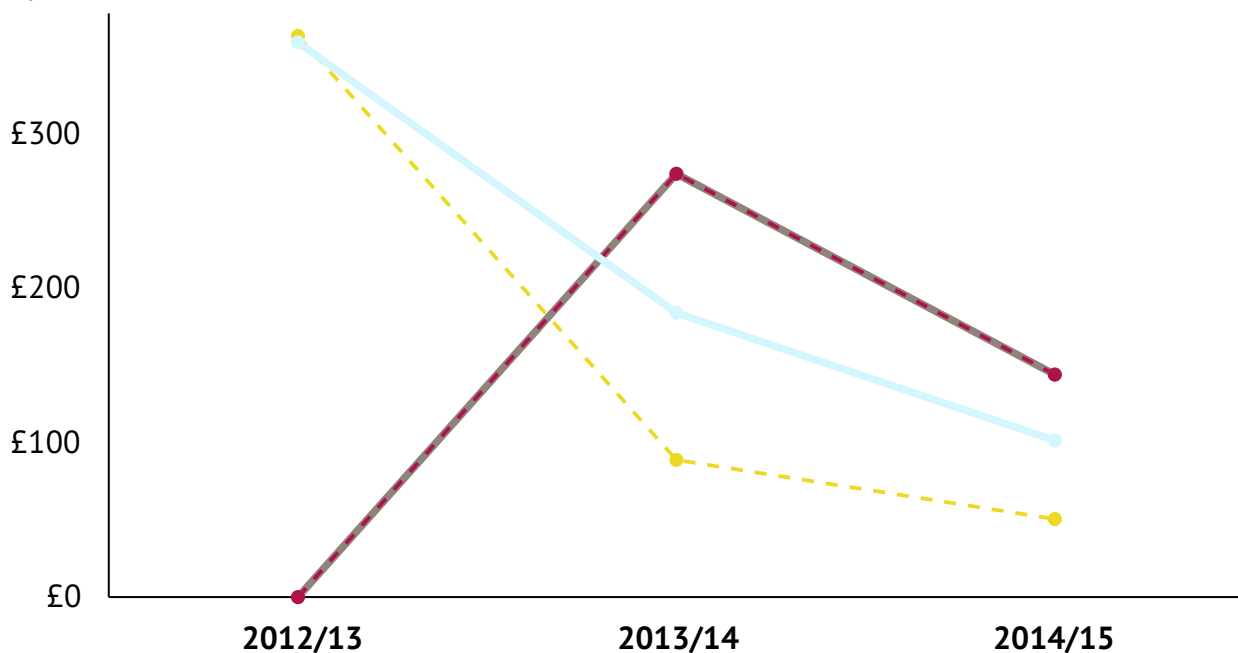

Academies income as a percentage of total funds

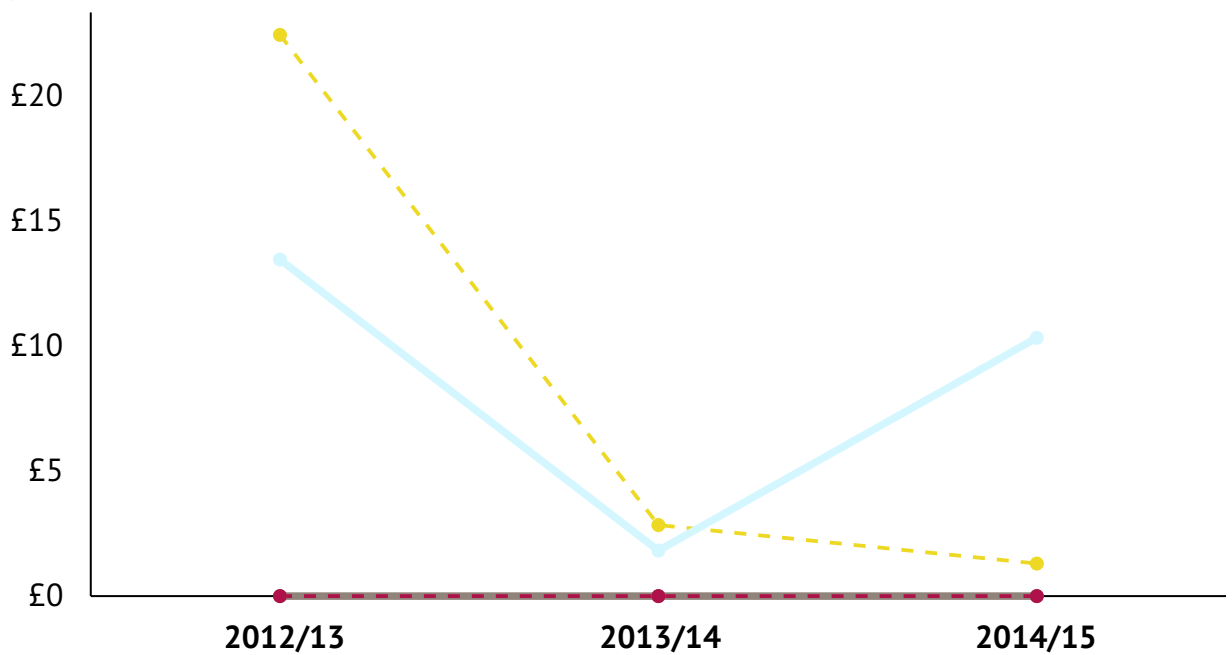

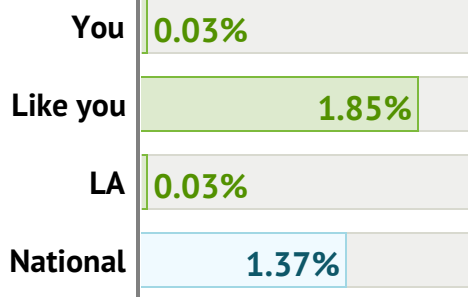

Non-government revenue as a percentage of total funds

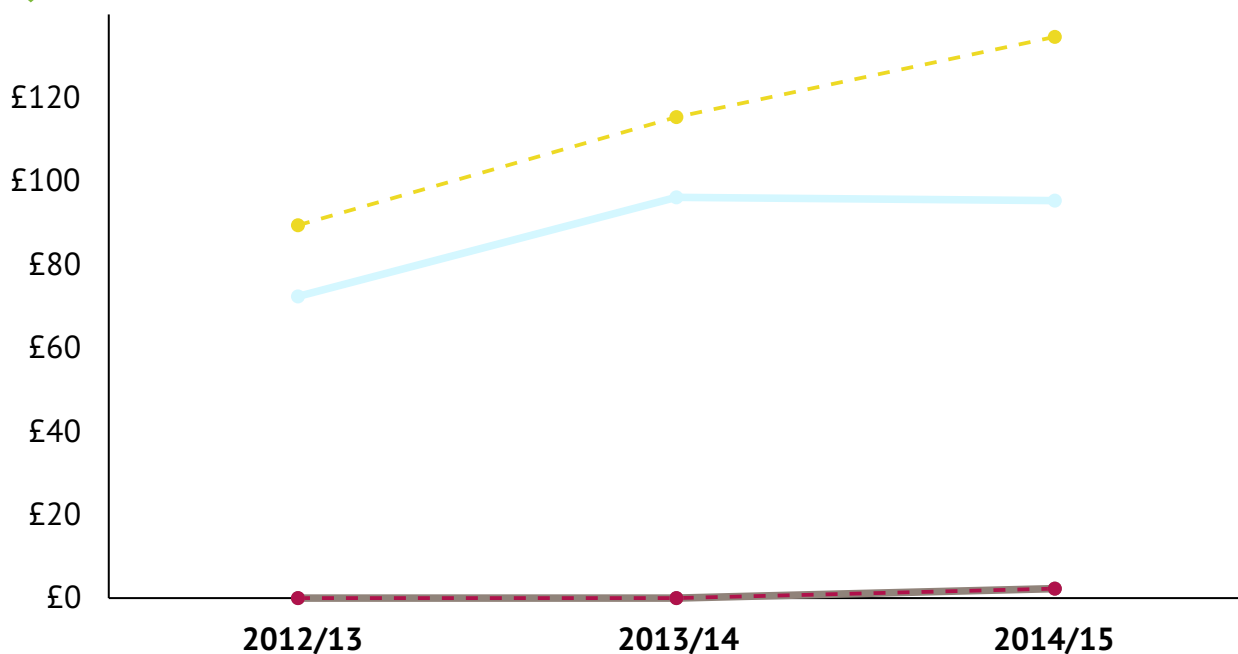

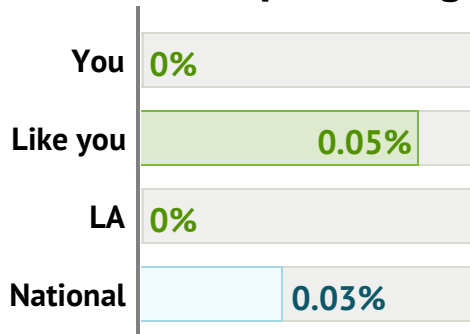

Non-grant government sources as a percentage of total funds

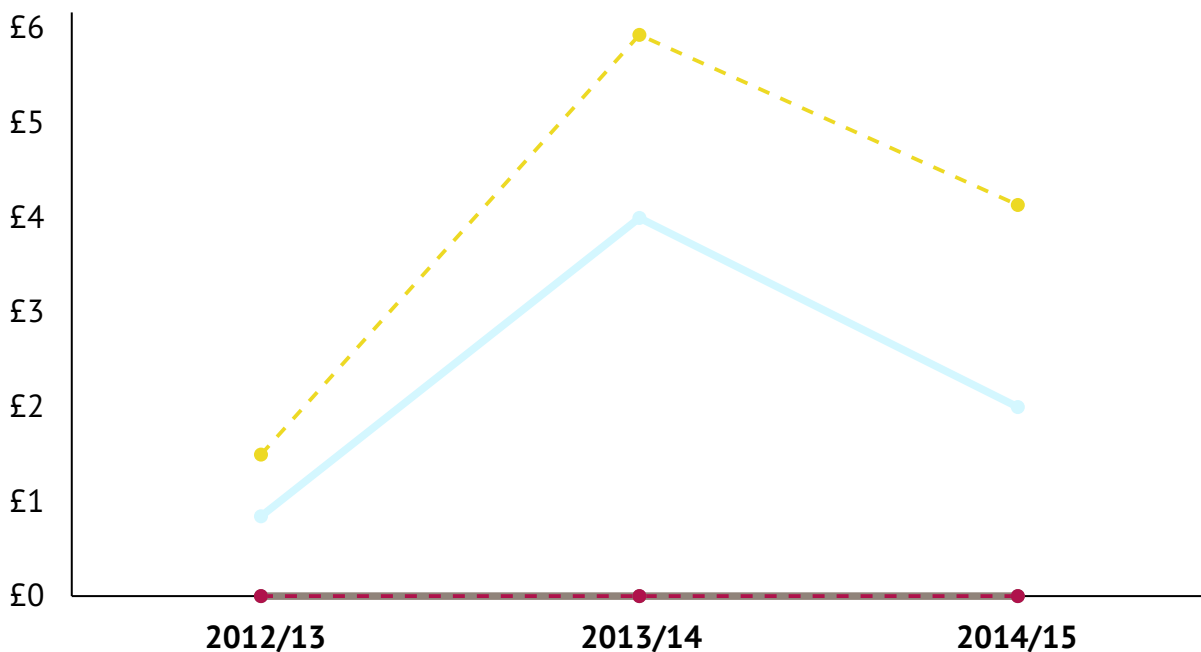

Donations and voluntary funds as a percentage of total funds

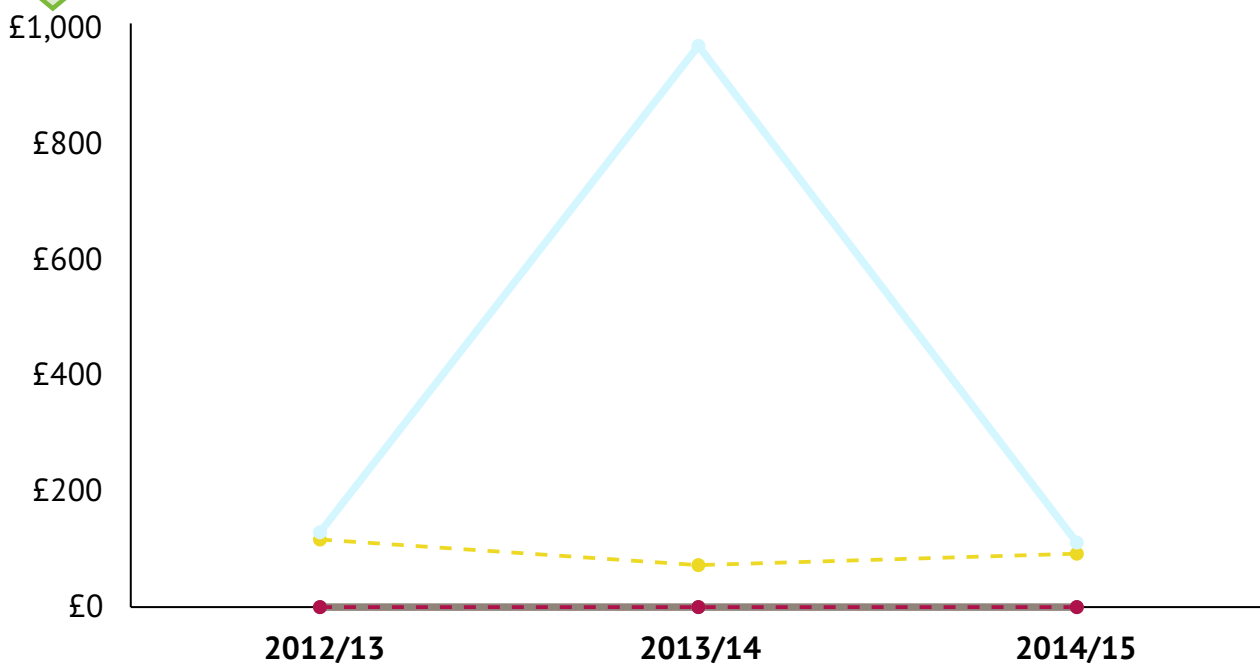

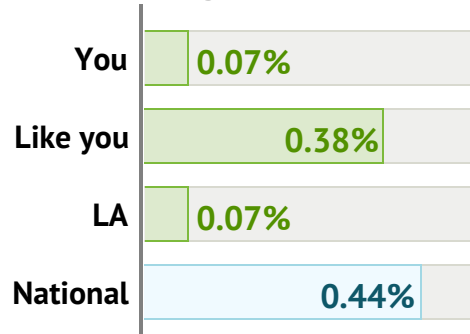

Investment income as a percentage of total funds

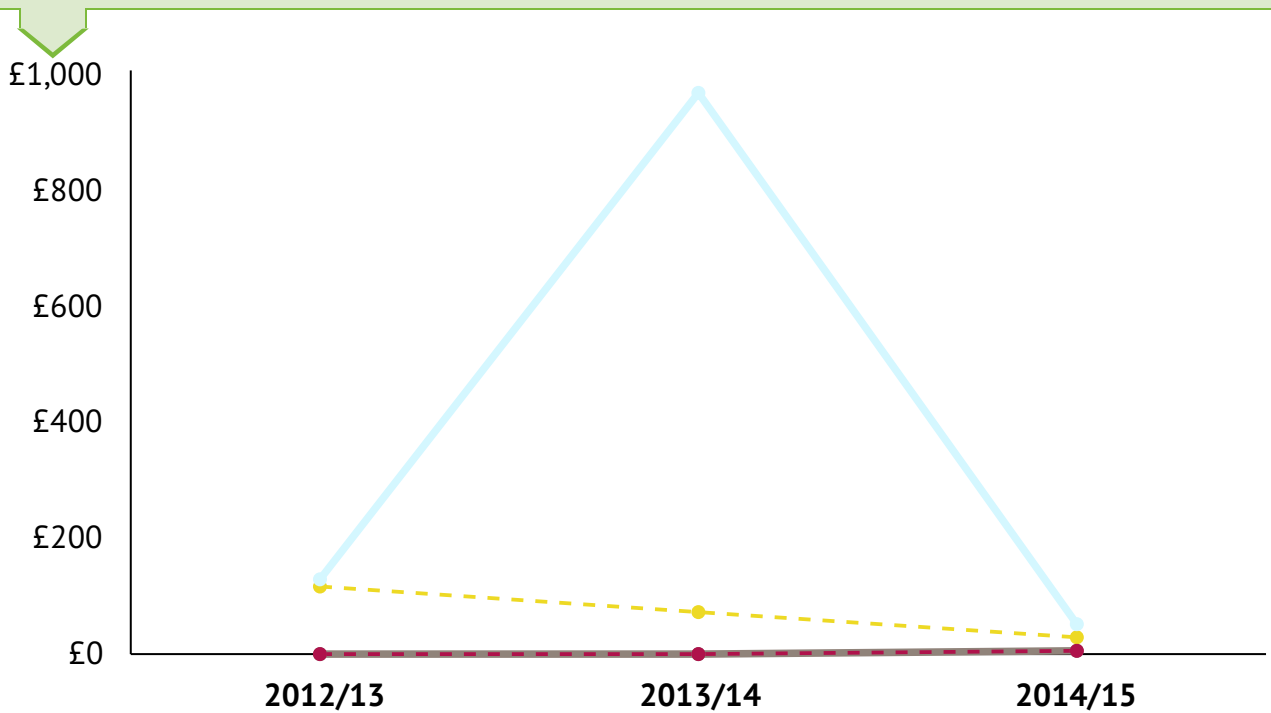

Spend on teaching staff as a percentage of total spend

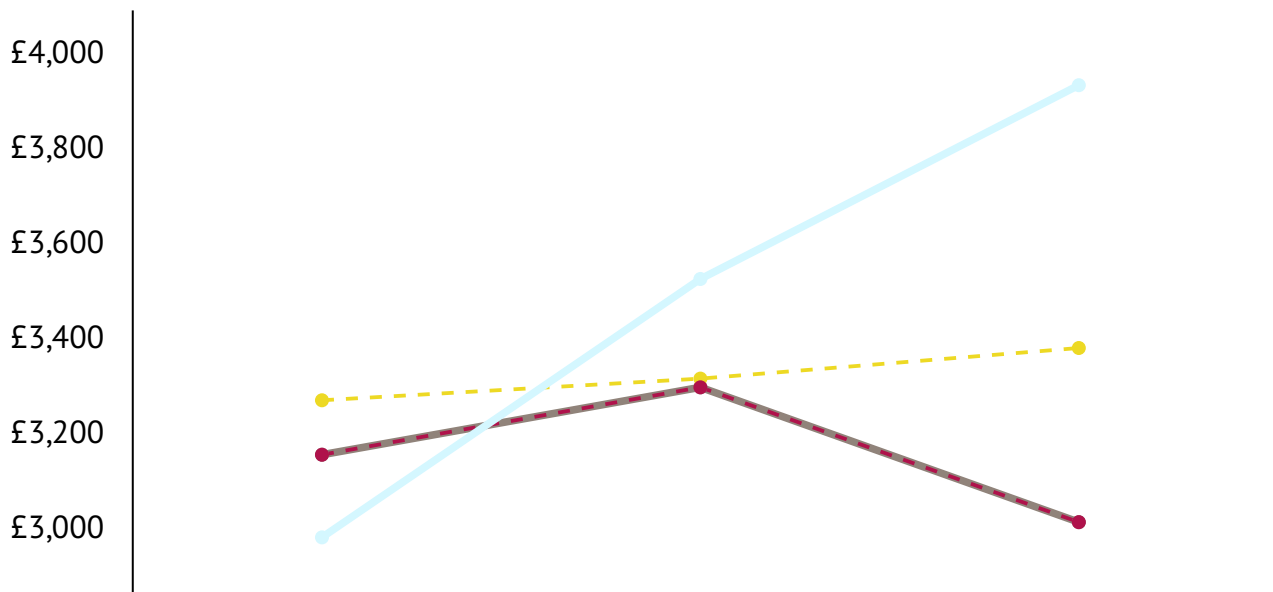

Spend on supply teachers as a percentage of total spend

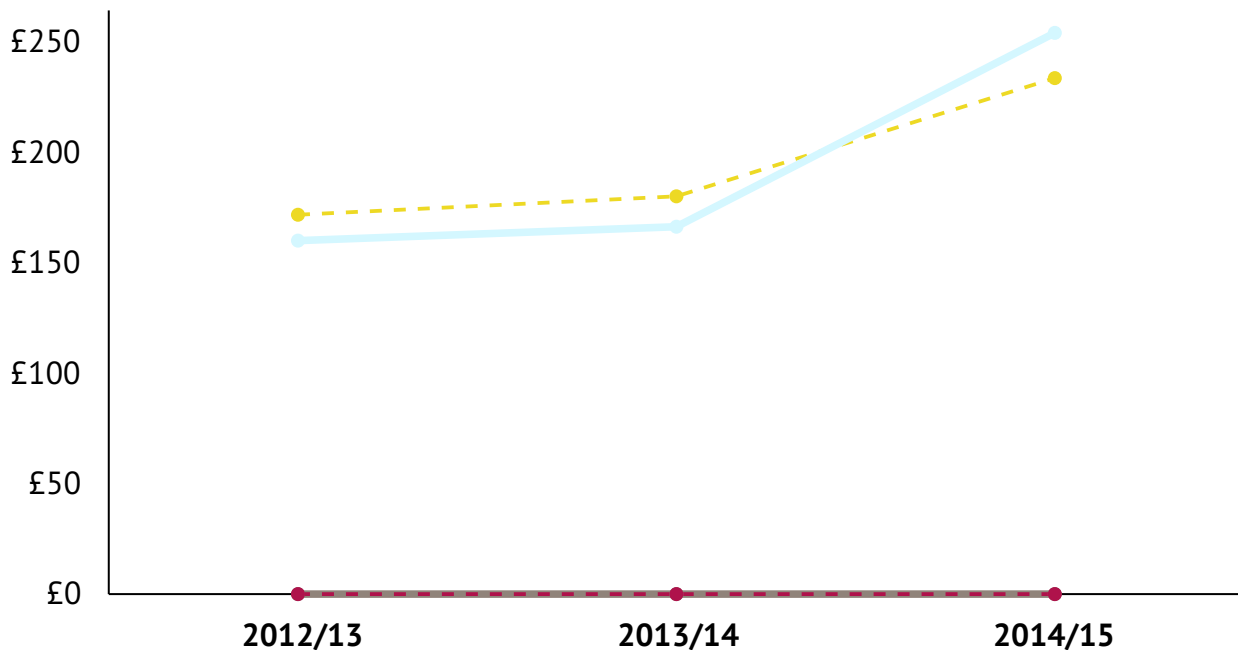

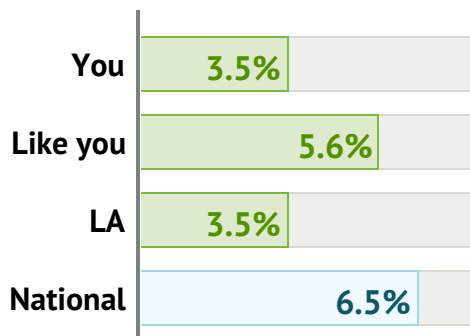

Spend on learning resources (non-ICT) as a percentage of total spend

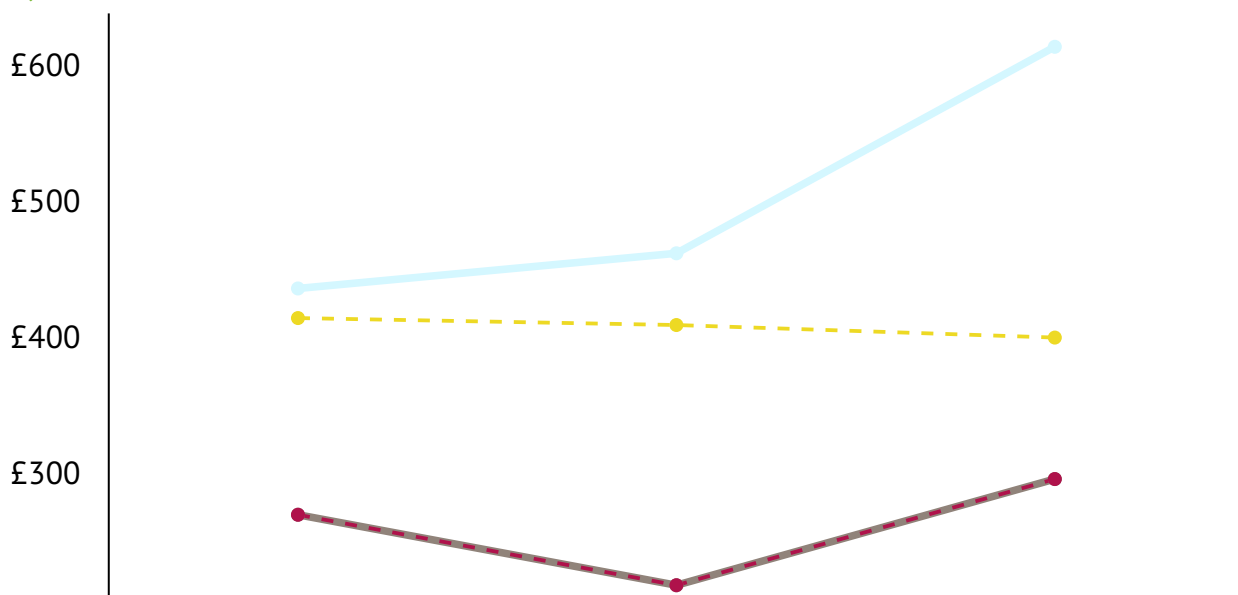

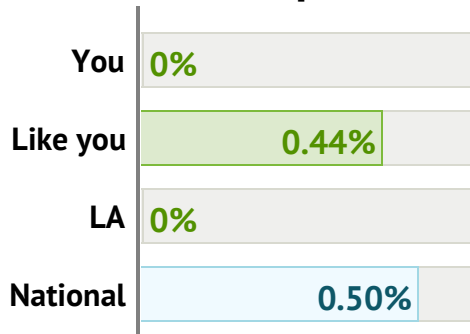

Spend on ICT Learning resources as a percentage of total spend

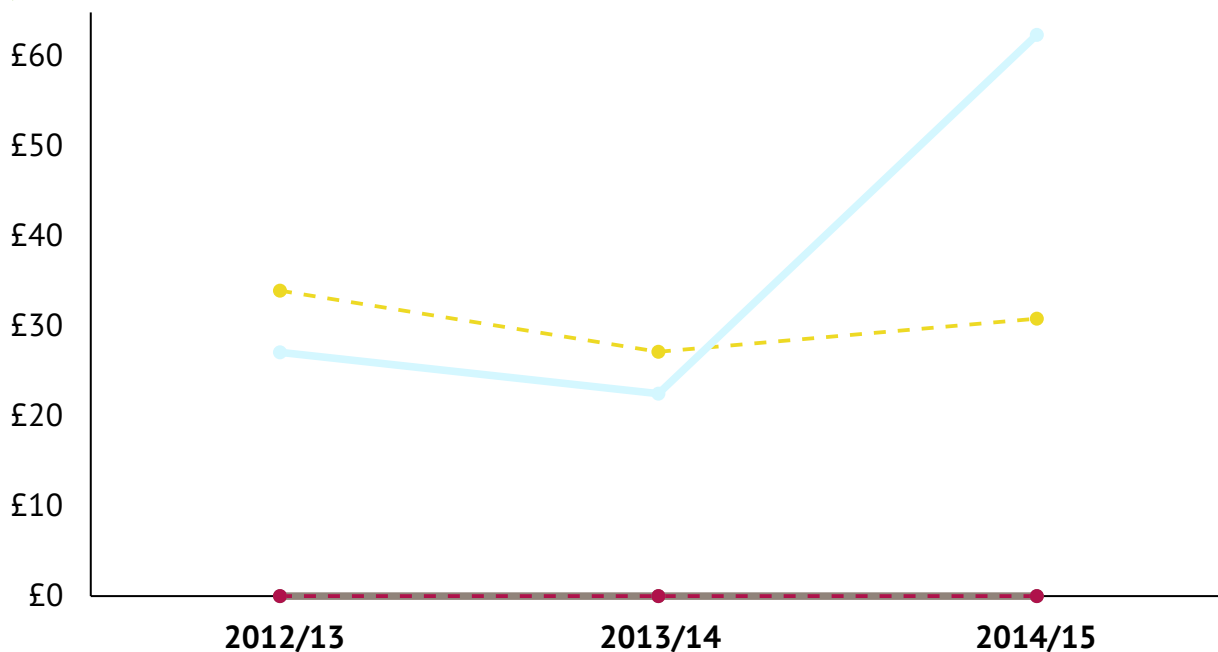

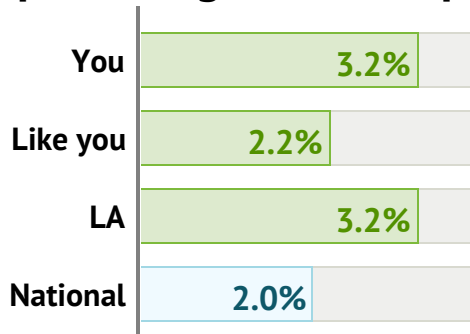

Spend on other staff costs as a percentage of total spend

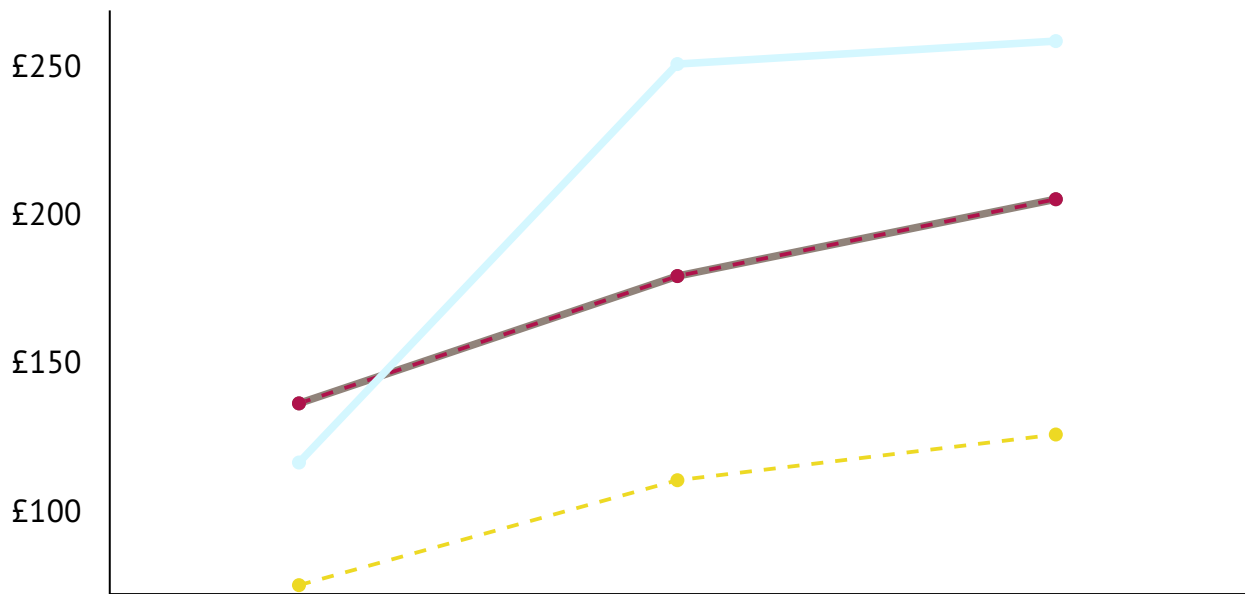

How we did this for Sunnyville

Why create a report?

This report has been created just for Sunnyville to help you see the power information can have when intelligently analysed, and intuitively presented. We hope you will use it to help with your annual academies finance process, for reporting to governors, school and MAT leadership, and to draw helpful insights from your data.

How did you get the data?

This report has been created using Academies' Financial Benchmarking Data from 2014/15 as released for the first time in August 2016. We combined this with data sourced from the Department for Education which our clever data scientists then imported into Arbor's Adaptive Management System for analysis and output. The result is an individual academies' financial budget report unique to each academy. No two are remotely alike. Each is special.

How difficult was it to do?

This report used our massively parallel analytics engine, which we've been developing for five years to help schools manage their data. It involved crunching 150 million data points almost instantly to produce 4400 individual PDF reports, one for every Academy (which reports their data) in England. From design to delivery took us around a day.

Why do I have some data missing?

We do the best with what we are given, but we're not magicians! Either the data wasn't reported to the DfE, or it was disguised to preserve anonymity, so we've listed it as not available.

How did you derive your LA and National averages?

We benchmarked Sunnyville on a variety of measures to allow you to analyse your budget in a wider context. We only compared Sunnyville to other all-through schools, both in the academies like you, local authority and national measures, making the comparison more meaningful. After all, a primary academy's spend is different from a secondary academy's, which is different from a special academy. An average that included all three would be misleading.

What is a school 'like you'?

We created the schools like you measure to give you the most meaningful comparison to Sunnyville. First, we filtered by all all-through schools for the reasons mentioned above. Then, we filtered by schools who were inside/outside London as this changes your cost structure. Next we filtered by size, ensuring that Sunnyville is compared to schools with a similar number of students. Finally we took your FSM, SEN and EAL data, weighted them 26%, 67% and 7% respectively, based on the size of the attainment gaps at KS2, and combined them into a baseline score to find schools with similar demographic intakes to Sunnyville. We used a statistical algorithm to identify those schools which are most statistically similar to your score, and benchmarked your performance based on this. After all that, we sat down and had a cup of tea as we were exhausted!

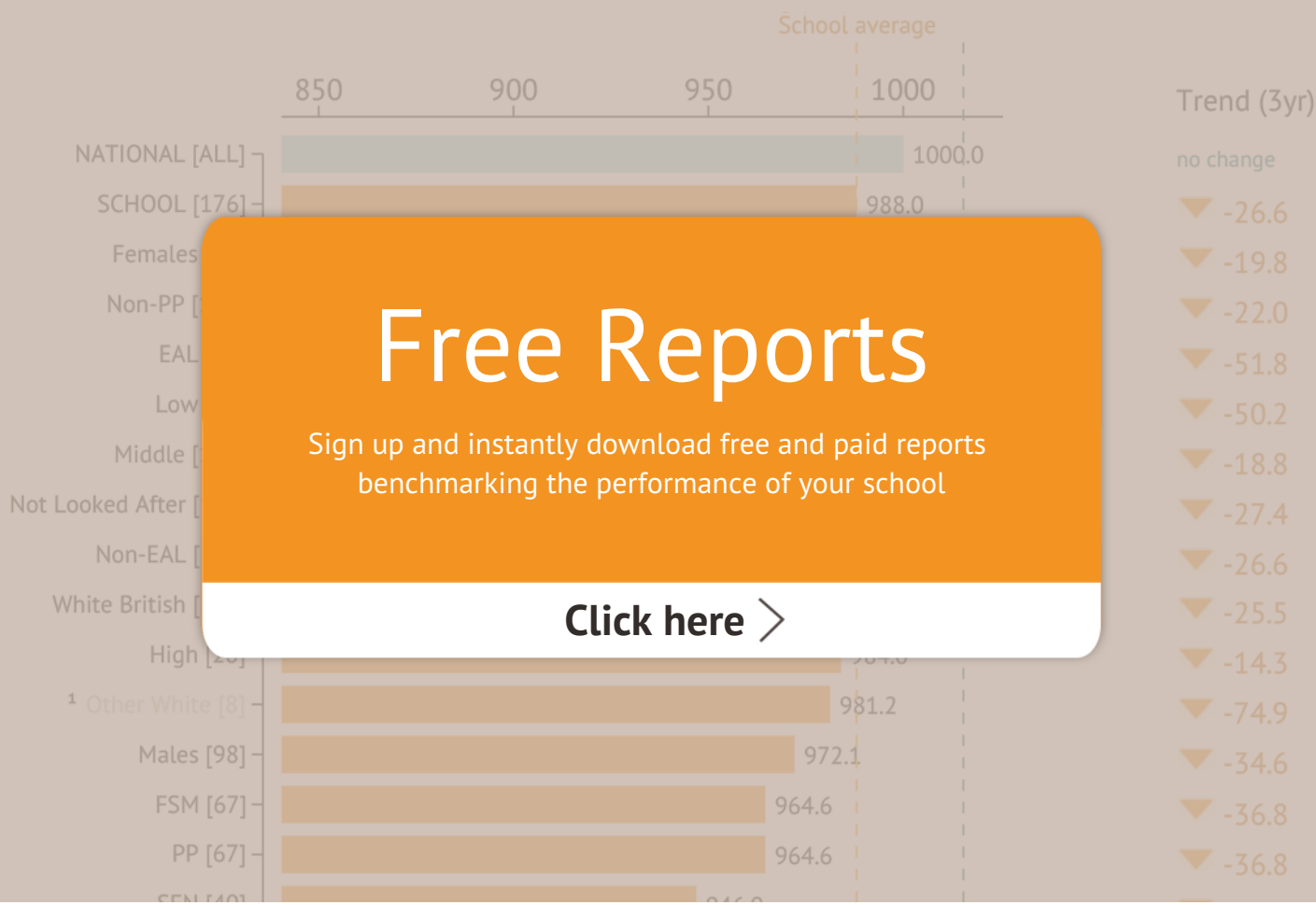

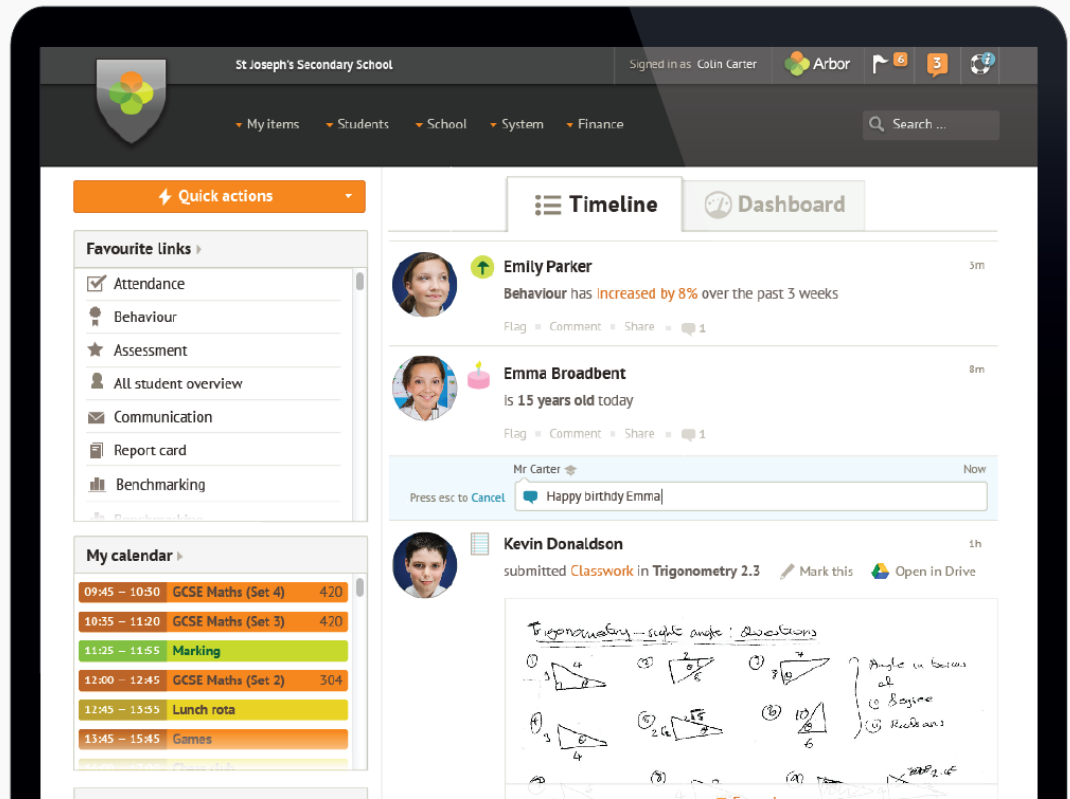
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
